The new building is just north of Indian School Road on the east side of 24th Street. The Bar is moving because its 11-year lease has expired at its current location, and the organization faced a significant increase in its lease costs.

The Bar will occupy about 60 percent of the new building, with the remainder already leased to tenants, whose payments will generate income for the State Bar. The Arizona Foundation for Legal Services & Education will be one of those tenants.
